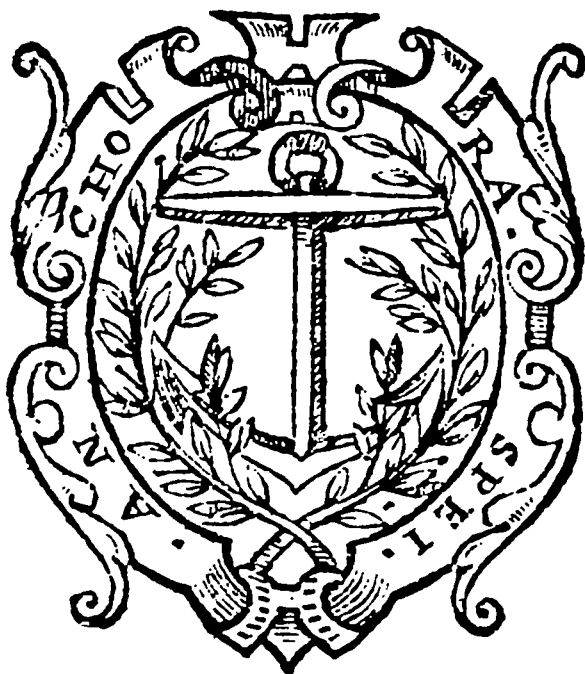

Moreover, the concerns of philosophy often converge with those of medicine, as philosophers attempt to understand the nature of knowledge and the human condition.
